Section No 1 There shall be a new side-walk constructed within sixty days from passage and publication of this ordinance, commencing at the south east corner of lot no (47) forty seven in the Village of Tillmore, and running north twenty feet on the east end, and adjoining said lot no. 47 along and adjoining the land owned by S.H. Davidson, said side-walk to four feet wide constructed of stone suitable for side walk purposes the top of said side walk to be on a uniform grade of side-walk adjoining on north.
