Sec 1 There shall not be any teams
single or double tied to any hitch
sack or driven upon main Street
within one block east & one block
west of the public well from 8 to 10 P.M.
on any evening when Band concert
are in progress on the Band stand
over the public well in the Village
of Hillmon Missouri

Section 2 The Village Marshall shall see that main street within one block ^(East and West) west of the Public well in said village of Hillmon on said nights when Band concerts are in progress shall be cleared of ^{any} teams by 8 P.M. and he shall stretch a rope across said main street one block east and one block west of said public well and shall stretch rope across cross street from Round Prairie Bank to H.C. Harro's store and from the Andrew Co Mercantile Co store to N.H. Gregory's store.

Section 3 any person who shall during the time when said Band concerts are in progress permit his team to be either tied to any hitch rack or driven upon said main street or shall cut break through or let down any ropes so stretched across said streets shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than one nor more than five dollars for every such offence. This Ordinance to take effect and be in force from and after its passage by the Board of Trustees of the Inhabitants of the Village of Hillmon and its publication in one issue of the Hillmon Leader approved by the Board of Trustees.
