A Special Ordinance in relation to sidewalks

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Subdivisions of the Village of Fillmore Missouri, as follows

Section 1. There shall be rebuilt, or repaired so as to be in good condition for pedestrians to walk on, within thirty days from the passage and publication of this ordinance, the sidewalk on the west side of ^{and adjoining} Lots No 52, 53, 54 & 53, in original town of Newark, now Fillmore, Missouri, now owned and controlled by W B Gilbert. Said walk shall be four feet wide, made of oak or walnut lumber, oak Posts and stringers, Posts set in the ground two or more feet and to extend above the ground about eighteen inches, said Posts to be not more than six feet apart running north and south in three tiers, tiers to be two feet apart. The boards to be laid on said sidewalk to be one and one half inches in thickness, and six to eight inches in width, said boards to be securely nailed to three stringers, said stringers to be two by five inches, and not less than twelve feet long, and to be securely nailed to said Posts with sixteen or twenty penny nails, and flooring to be nailed to the said stringers with sixteen penny nails, six nails to the board, said sidewalk to be made on, and at the same grade, as the present old walk is now laid

Section 2. There shall be rebuilt, or repaired, so as to be in good condition for pedestrians to walk on, within thirty days from the passage, and publication of this ordinance, the sidewalk on the west side of Lot No 99, and west side of south part of Lot No 100, in the original town of Newark, now Fillmore, Mo, now owned and controlled by J R Davis, said sidewalk to be four feet wide constructed of oak or walnut boards, about one and one half inches in thickness, and from six to eight inches in width, laid on three oak or walnut stringers two by five inches, and

not less than twelve feet in length, said stringers laid on rock pillars, about four feet apart, plank to be nailed to said stringers with six sixteen penny nails to each plank.

Said sidewalk to be made on, and at the same grade, as the present old walk is now laid.

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This Ordinance to take effect and be in force from and after its passage by the Board of Trustees of the Inhabitants of the Village of Fillmore, Missouri, and its publication for two consecutive weeks in the Fillmore Leader, a weekly published in Fillmore, Missouri
