Be it ordained by The Board of Trustees of the Village of Fillmore, as follows:

Section I.— It shall be unlawful for any person to hitch or tie horses, or other animals to any of the telephone or telegraph poles in the Village of Fillmore, or to post up or tack any bills or notices on such poles, or to drive any nails, tacks or spikes into any of said poles for any purpose whatever.

Section II.— Any person guilty of violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine of not less than one (\$1) nor more than one hundred dollars (\$100), or by imprisonment not more than three months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force, from and after its passage, and publication for four consecutive weeks in the Fillmore Leader, a paper published in the Village of Fillmore, Mo., as provided in section four of ordinance number twenty-six, of the ordinances of the Village of Fillmore.
